The PE & Sports Premium Grant is designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the Physical Education and sport activities they offer their pupils.

For financial year 2016/17 Schools with 17 or more eligible pupils receive £8,000 and an additional payment of £5 per pupil.

Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer.

This means that you should use the premium to:

- develop or add to the PE and sport activities that your school already offers
- make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

- Developing the quality of P.E lessons- assessment tools and termly observations. This will aim to ensure that PE and School Sport is judged as at least good by external monitoring.
- Developing a high quality programme for physical literacy through the Leap into Life scheme, and by identifying children working below expected levels of progress in physical development
- Create consistency in the quality of PE teaching and learning for children progressing from primary to secondary school
- To bring in Key Stage 3 & 4 children to lead sessions with Kingswear children to help establish rapport and relationships between primary and secondary provisions.
- Creating a playtime leader programme to support positive play and sporting activities
- Broadening the sporting opportunities and experiences available to pupils. E.g Fencing surfing, kayaking

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
